BE PROUD OF OUR 'RASTRABHASHA'

Hindi Diwas is observed on September 14, every year. Hindi is the fourth most spoken language in the world after English, Spanish and Mandarin. Hindi is one of the most widely spoken languages of India, with most of North India celebrating the language as their mother tongue. Hindi Diwas was celebrated in Dwarka on 14th September, Wednesday in schools, colleges, offices, organizations and other enterprises. In schools and colleges Hindi Diwas activities were organised with unique programs and competitions related to Hindi poems, story recitations, vocabulary quizzes, etc. Every year on Hindi Diwas, the president of India

presents the Rajbhasha awards to people for their contribution towards the language at a ceremony in Delhi. Hindi is an Indo-Aryan language, written in the Devanagari script as one of the official languages of India. Hindi is one of the two official languages of the Union government - the other being English. It is one of the 22 scheduled languages of the Republic of India. Hindi Diwas is dedicated to promote and propagate the official language. Also, this day is celebrated; as a patriotic reminder to Indian populations of their common roots and unity. On September 14, 1949, the constituent assembly of India adopted Hindi as the official language of the

newly formed nation. The decision was then accepted and it became a part of the Indian constitution on January 26, 1950. The first Hindi Diwas was celebrated in 1953. People like Beohar Rajendra Simha, Hazari Prasad Dwivedi, Kaka Kalelkar, Maithili Sharan Gupta and Seth Govind Das lobbied hard in favor of Hindi to be made the official language of India. Beohar Rajendra Simha is best known for his illustrations in the original final manuscript of the Constitution of India. Schools and colleges in India on this day organize literary and cultural programs, competitions in Hindi where all students participate. The first Prime Minister of the country, Jawaharlal


Nehru, decided to celebrate Hindi Day on September 14. Says Tejashri Shukla, teacher, "Our school organised poem, essays, and recitation competitions and encouraged students to take part and celebrate the language and be proud of it. You can witness a number of literary activities as well as celebrations to commemorate the memorable day in all schools and colleges." Adds Ritu Wadhwa, another teacher, "Hindi is the better mode of communication among the people in India so it should be promoted among each other. Hindi is known as the 2nd most commonly spoken language of the world."

Pet/Stray Dogs

Cops Solution Pvt. Ltd., an organization set up by Delhi Police ACP (Retd) Rajender Singh and Ram Singh in 2020 in Dwarka, Sector-19, share their views, provisions and rights of Animals in the country.



Prevention of Cruelty to Animal (Amendment) Bill 2022 is proposed in Parliament to enhance the punishment in the Act. Rs. 10,000-25,000 and up to one year imprisonment for first time and 50,000- 1 lac and not less than one-year up to 2 years on subsequent offence against meagre punishment of Rs. 25/50.

As per S-399 of DMC Act, the registration/ license is mandatory for pets in Delhi/NCR against the payment of Rs. 500/-. The charges are inclusive of fees and vaccination certificate. Three photographs of the pet and details of the caregiver have to be submitted. The registration can also be done online through MCD Citizen portal, veterinary clinic and Kennel Club of India.

For non-registration/license punishment are given under 461, 465 of DMC Act or sometimes administrative directions are also issued charging a certain amount in case of non-registration of pet dogs. In case of S- 428 IPC- maiming, killing, poisoning, rendering useless animal of the cost of Rs. 10 or 429 IPC- animal worth Rs. 50 and above. Punishment may be attracted and punishment will be up to 2 yrs in 428 IPC and up to 5 years in 429 IPC. 289 IPC - a person fails to guard against danger to human life, hurt from animal, will be punished for up to 6 months or fine of Rs. 1000/- To protect the animal rights, following provisions and facilities are available for organisations dealing with the pet/ stray dogs:

Dog and man live in coexistence expected to show compassion towards pet and collaborative efforts through all stakeholders. No arbitrary rules may be framed by RWA/MC against the law of the land in respect to animals. The principle of area friendly approach, dogs, being territorial in nature, will apply in respect to stray/street dogs.

Pet owners: Any unnecessary nuisance by pet dogs should be stopped; no unnecessary barking at night time; on direction alternate lifts may be used; stop the poop, take dog at designated place to relieve and to part at designated time, pet must be duly vaccinated, sterilised, clean and healthy and use of anti-rabies vaccination, leashing may be used in public place.

Caregiver: for stray or street dog: to ensure sterilisation and vaccination, no left-over food remains in the area, to provide health care, to feed away from residential place and children,

RWA: No ban may be invoked, No fine may be imposed, No bye laws may be framed which go against the basic law, barking and poop and danger may not be reason of ban even with full consensus, alternative lift may be provided if regular lift is not given, use of parks and residential premises can't be banned for their movement, No use of muzzle may be enforced, No intimidation for 'giving up' and 'abandoning' may be caused.

Treating Animals Cruelly-

If any person -

(a) Beats, kicks, over-rides, over-drives, over-loads, tortures or otherwise treats any animal so as to subject it to unnecessary pain or suffering or causes or, being the owner permits, any animal to be so treated.

(b) Employs in any work or labour or for any purpose any animal which, by reason of its age or any disease, infirmity, wound, sore or other cause, is unfit to be so employed or, being the owner, permits any such unfit animal to be so employed;

(c) Willfully and unreasonably administers any injurious drug or injurious substance.

(d) Conveys or carries any animal in such a manner or position as to subject it to unnecessary pain or suffering.

(e) Keeps or confines any animal in any cage.

(f) Keeps for an unreasonable time any animal chained.

(g) Fails to provide such animal with sufficient food, drink or shelter.

(h) Offers for sale or, without reasonable cause, has in his possession any animal which is suffering pain by reason of mutilation, starvation, thirst, overcrowding or other ill-treatment.

(i) Solely with a view to providing entertainment-

(j) Organises, keeps, uses or acts in the management of, any place for animal fighting or for the purpose of baiting any animal or permits or offers any place to be so used or receives money for the admission of any other person to any place kept or used for any such purposes.

(k) promotes or takes part in any shooting match or competition wherein animals are released from captivity for the purpose of such shooting; he shall be punishable, in the case of a first offence, with fine which shall not be less than ten rupees but which may extend to fifty rupees and in the case of a second or subsequent offence committed within three years of the previous offence, with fine which shall not be less than twenty-five rupees but which may extend to one hundred rupees or with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three months, or with both.


For the purposes of sub-section (1), an owner shall be deemed to have committed an offence if he has failed to exercise reasonable care and supervision with a view to the prevention of such offence.

India stands at C grade in the international index of Animal Protection. Delhi High Court had issued directions in June 2021 and allowed stray dog feeding in every residential society and held directions validly issued by AWBI. The Supreme court stayed the order of Delhi High Court issued for stray dogs in June 2021 and issued notices to all concerned in the matter. The matter is sub judice as of now.

MUNICIPAL WARD BOUNDARIES REDRAWN

The delimitation committee of the state election commission has redrawn the boundaries of municipal wards with at least 24 assembly constituencies witnessing major changes. The panel has deleted or merged wards in 23 constituencies and added one ward in one of them.



Out of these 24, municipal wards in 23 have been decreased and increased in one, thereby reaching the figure of 250 from the existing 272. Constituencies in Northeast, North, Northwest and West Delhi have seen the biggest alterations as the population density and sizes of the ward is higher in these areas. Burari, Timarpur, Badli, Sultanpur Majra, Mangolpuri, Rohini, Shalimar Bagh, Wazirpur, Model Town, Sadar Bazar, Madipur, Rajouri Garden, Janakpuri, Uttam Nagar, Dwarka, Matiala, Najafgarh, Deoli, Sangam Vihar, Trilokpuri, Kondli, Shahdara, Seemapuri are constituencies in which the number of wards has been decreased.

Mustafabad is the only one where wards have been increased. This has been done to achieve parity in terms of population and size, said the official. There are changes in the remaining wards as well, but the number of wards is the same overall. Sources in the delimitation commission said if things go as per plan, they will complete the exercise by November. The commission has given time for public feedback till October 3. Thereafter, it will take around two weeks to incorporate suggestions and the final draft will be sent to MHA for notification. Once notified, the ball will be in the court of the election commission to hold polls, said an official. Delimitation is basic-

ly a process to redraw the boundaries of constituencies to reflect changes in population. The redrawing of these boundaries is based on the recent census. While announcing the delimitation exercise, the panel had said that it was taking Delhi's 2011 census as reference and fixing the population in each municipal ward at 65,675, with a variation of plus or minus 10%. However, there are at least 100 municipal wards where the variation is much more than that figure with some reporting a difference of up to 90%, experts have pointed out. Officials claimed that the population of the wards has been divided on the basis of the total population of that assembly constituency, but there are instances where within the same constituency there is a major gap between the population of two wards. The delimitation exercise was necessitated by the Union home ministry's announcement that the three municipal corporations would be unified, hours before the schedule for the trifurcated MCD elections was to be announced in March this year. The home ministry later fixed the number of wards in the reunified MCD at 250 and announced the formation of a delimitation committee in July, giving it four months to complete the exercise and submit the final report. On September 12, the delimitation panel came out with the draft report specifying areas

and maps of MCD's 250 wards. The 900-page report is available on the state election commission website and people have been invited to submit their objections and suggestions by October 3. The panel is expecting feedback from the public from this weekend. The constituencies where one ward has been deleted include Matiala (Ghumanhera removed), Dwarka, Burari, Uttam Nagar, Najafgarh, Rohini, Shalimar Bagh, Badli, Timarpur (GTB Nagar), Sultanpur Majra, Najafgarh and Sangam Vihar. The only constituency with a population of more than 4 lakh is Matiala but the panel has proposed to reduce the number of wards from seven to six here. In the rest of the assembly constituencies, minor changes have been made in the boundaries, but in 20 constituencies, the names of at least one ward have been changed. Now there are 6 wards under Matiala Constituency as against 7 earlier. Ghumanhera has been removed and wards that remain include Dwarka A, Dwarka B, Matiala, Kakrola, Nangali Sakrawati and Chawla. The Ward numbers of Dwarka have also changed. Dwarka A is now 121 and Dwarka B is now 120. The older ward numbers were Dwarka A- 36 S and Dwarka B- 38 S. Sector-8 and 9 falls under in Dwarka Ward-C, 130, Sector-7 falls under Palam Ward-135, Sector-1 in Mahavir Enclave-137 and Sector-2 in Madhu Vihar-136. All societies in Sector-3 and DDA Pkt-1 and 2 are merged in Matiala Ward (Ward No-122), rest part is merged with Dwarka-A Ward, Sector-16B is also merged in Dwarka-A Ward. There are no changes in Dwarka-B Ward.

The proposal was to have 77,962 votes in Dwarka A and 74,582 votes in Dwarka B out of 1,52,544 votes. Very surprisingly the commission has retained the number of voters almost same as of 2016. How come they could not see the increase in number of voters in last five years? Sector-3 societies and DDA pockets have been included in Matiala ward. In 2016, they had clubbed Sector-4 and 5 with Matiala and this year, they did it with sector-3. This is not acceptable at all. I request the management committee of societies and RWA to come together and demand Sector 3 in Dwarka A ward. 



RESIDENTS PROTEST BRUTAL KILLING OF DOG

A report of some residents of Kunj Apartments, Sector 12, Dwarka inflicting cruel and extremely maltreatment to a dog has irked animal lovers of the sub city. It is reported that some residents of the society killed a dog by throwing it to the ground from the 10th floor. Few dog lovers of the sub city took out a silent protest march to condemn this brutal action. According to Priyanka, a resident of Kunj Vihar society, she was told of this incident in the morning, when she found the lifeless dog lying on the ground. She took it to a veterinarian who pronounced it dead. It was buried afterwards. However, it was later found that the animal was purposely thrown from the 10th floor by some people. After which the body of the dog was exhumed for post mortem and it was found that the death was due to crushing of bones after being thrown from a great height. A police complaint was lodged. Concerned citizens took out a march in Sector 13 from the service road near the Radisson Blu hotel. They condemned this cruelty and demanded action against those involved.

The mysterious death of the dog in Kunj Vihar is being blown out of proportion. No one knows how the dog fell from the one of the upper floors of the society. One of the residents, Priyanka, is spreading the news that the dog has been thrown and killed. Priyanka has been warned again and again for making the society lifts and other common areas dirty. Despite reminders she did not mend her ways and on a few occasions, police were called in. She is trying to malign the image of our society.

They have been taken over by none other but beggars! Beggars all over Dwarka can be seen living bags and baggage on footpaths and traffic triangles.

They have illegally occupied the public place and are spoiling the aesthetic beauty of Dwarka. At Aashirwaad Chowk, on traffic triangles, one can see some people, mostly vendors and hawkers sleeping in the open at night. They sell balloons and other items on the crossing. They have occupied the footpaths with all their belongings – bags, bundles of clothes, bed sheets, mattress and cooking utensils etc. These beggars run behind



cars selling tissues, incense sticks and cloth dusters. This is not only annoying but risky too and also it is not a pleasant sight. Not that the police do not know about them but they turn a blind eye towards them. Says a policeman, "We do not say anything to them out of compassion. They are migrants and have nowhere to go. Where will they go? Of-course we keep checking their belongings." The police say that they are only trying

to earn a living. One knows there are really very few avenues open to them. The residents however quote security issues caused by beggars who have occupied footpaths. They feel that beggars are increasing on footpaths and one can see beggars encroaching around and inside Idiot Chowk and Sector-6 triangles. These need to be removed as they are a security threat. The police must look into the matter and act to remove these beggars.

MORE DISPENSARIES NEEDED IN DWARKA

CGHS Dispensary at Sector 9 fails to manage the multitude of patients and the worst sufferers are the senior citizens in their 70's and 80's. Dwarka has at present only two CGHS dispensaries, one in Sector 9 and another in Sector-23 of the sub-city, to cater to thousands of patients daily. Most of the patients flock to the Sector 9 dispensary in an unmanageable multitude which the doctors and staff find difficult to cope with. According to K. S. Bhati, "The patients sweat while waiting for hours outside the dispensary, which is too small and scantily staffed to dispense medical aid to so many beneficiaries." The worst sufferers are the senior citizens in their 70's and 80's. They do not find a spot to even sit while waiting for hours to be examined by the doctors and get their medicines. Bhati further informs, "It is gathered that a plot for an additional CGHS dispensary is lying undeveloped in Sector 11 of Dwarka. This dispensary needs to be constructed without delay and provided with the requisite medical staff and medicines." Rough estimate reveals that 5-7 dispensaries of larger size would be required to look after the medical needs of the CGHS beneficiaries in the sub-city.




NATURE IS FULL OF BEAUTY

Our national flag depicts the culture of our country with three colour stripes and Ashok chakra in between, which shows that a lot of thinking has gone into designing it. There was an amendment in the statute that now even common man can hoist flag in his house, which is a welcome step. However, unknowingly some disrespect also meted to the flag, for example we find flags flying on road side, highways, streets. The law must be made clear to all. Also, a lot of awareness is required as to how to dispose of old flags, or to be handed over to which agency who will take care of such old flags. So, the law should give directions on how to handle such issues. Whether people can display on vehicles is permissible or not. Such issues must be made clear to the public, so that adequate respect is accorded to our national flag."


